







# What is the Relay For Life movement?

Each American Cancer Society Relay For Life event gives everyone an opportunity to fight cancer and help save more lives. Teams made up of family members, friends, and/or coworkers camp out at a local school, park, or fairground and take turns walking around a track or path. Because cancer never sleeps, each team is asked to have a representative on the track at all times during the overnight event.

Relay For Life is the signature fundraising event for the American Cancer Society. At the event, you will have the opportunity to celebrate cancer survivors, remember loved ones lost to the disease, and learn more about how to fight back against cancer. While you're raising much-needed funds, you'll also be raising awareness of the importance of cancer prevention, early detection, treatment, and patient support.

### **Celebrate Survivors and Caregivers**

At Relay For Life events, cancer survivors and caregivers can come together and be recognized for their personal fight against a disease that has taken too much. In addition to a special ceremony, Survivors and Caregivers laps open the event and serve as a testament to the fight against cancer and the hope for a cure. All survivors and caregivers are invited to join their local Relay For Life event, no matter where their personal journey with cancer has taken them.

# **Remember during the Luminaria Ceremony**

When the sun goes down, luminaria line the track, each one lit in honor or memory of those who have faced cancer – those who lost their battle, those who won, and those whose fight continues. For many, a Relay For Life event is where they can join together and find healing from their experience with cancer. The luminaria, each representing someone special, serve as a tribute to a community's fight against cancer.

# **Fight Back Ceremony**

The Fight Back Ceremony inspires Relay participants to make a personal commitment to help the fight against cancer. That personal commitment may be as simple as visiting the doctor, getting a screening test, quitting smoking, or talking to elected officials about cancer.

#### **Cancer Facts**

- Approximately 1 in 3 women in the US will develop cancer in her lifetime, while almost 1 in 2 men will be diagnosed with the disease.
- Cancer is the number two cause of death in the US, behind only heart disease.
- About half of all cancer deaths could be prevented in the US if people avoided tobacco products, maintained a healthy weight through diet and regular exercise, and got recommended cancer screenings.

### **Finding cures**

The American Cancer Society supports the best ideas of the brightest cancer researchers, who with each discovery are getting us closer to a world with less cancer and more birthdays.

- The Society awards approximately \$100 million in new research grants annually through its disciplined peer review process – a process so successful that 46 American Cancer Society grantees have gone on to receive the Nobel Prize.
- In total, more than \$3.8 billion has been invested in cancer research since 1946.
- The American Cancer Society has played an important role in nearly every major cancer research breakthrough of the past century, including mammography screening, bone marrow transplants, combination chemotherapy for childhood cancers, and the development of drugs to treat leukemia and breast cancer.

### Fighting back

Cancer is not just a health issue, but a political issue. As a grassroots force, the Society works with lawmakers to pass laws to defeat cancer and rally communities worldwide to join the fight. Funds raised through Relay For Life events help the Society advocate for all people to have access to critical cancer screening and follow-up treatment, regardless of income.

• We have helped uninsured, underinsured, and low-income women get breast and cervical cancer screening tests and follow-up treatment since 1991, and, along with the American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network<sup>SM</sup>, we have successfully fought for legislation protecting this care.
