

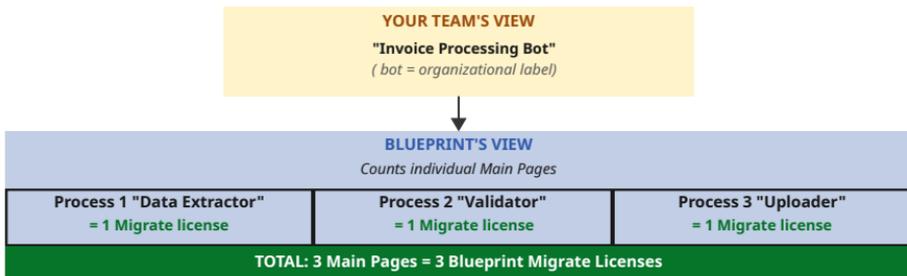
Understanding Blueprint Migrate Licensing for Blue Prism

1 Blue Prism Process = 1 Main Page = 1 Blueprint Migrate License

Consumes a License ✓	Does NOT consume a License ✗
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Blue Prism Processes — each contains exactly 1 Main page • Main Pages cannot be renamed or removed 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Blue Prism Objects — Objects do not contain Main Pages • Additional Pages within a Process (only the Main Page counts)

Common Misconception: “Bots” vs. Processes

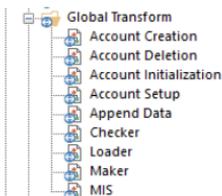
Many organizations group multiple Blue Prism Processes and Objects together under a single name and refer to this grouping as a “bot”, “automation”, or even a “process”. This is a common and reasonable way to describe the business function that these artifacts perform together.



Key Point: “Bot” is not a Blue Prism platform concept — it’s an organizational label. Blueprint Migrate licenses are formulaic and determined simply by number of Main Pages

Example: Counting Licenses

Consider a grouping called “**Global Transformation.**” Your team may refer to this as one bot, but it is composed of 9 Blue Prism Processes:



Because each of the 9 Processes contains exactly 1 Main Page, this grouping consumes **9 Blueprint Migrate licenses** — regardless of whether the team refers to it as one bot.

If this grouping also includes Blue Prism Objects, those Objects do **not** consume any additional licenses

Blue Prism Artifact	Has Main Page	License Consumed?
Blue Prism Process	Yes (exactly 1)	Yes - 1 license
Object	No	No
Additional Pages (within a Blue Prism Process or Object)	No (only Main page)	No
“Bot” or “Automation” grouping (N Processes)	Yes (1 per Main page)	Yes - 1 license per Main Page
