

Using the Peppol Network for Domestic E-Invoicing in Germany

Overview

The Peppol (Pan-European Public Procurement On-Line) network enables standardized electronic document exchange between businesses. For German domestic e-invoicing, both sender and receiver communicate through access points like HubBroker, which acts as the service provider connecting participants to the Peppol network.

Key Components

Participants

- **Sender**: The business issuing the e-invoice
- Receiver: The business receiving the e-invoice
- Service Provider (HubBroker): The certified Peppol access point facilitating the exchange

Identification

Each participant needs a Peppol ID (also called Participant ID), which in Germany typically uses:

- Leitweg-ID format: 0204:DExxxxxxxxx (for public sector)
- VAT number (Umsatzsteuer-Identifikationsnummer) format: 9930:DExxxxxxxxx
- GLN (Global Location Number) format: 0088:40xxxxxxxxxx
- Company registration number format: various schemes available

Outbound E-Invoicing Process (Sending)

1. Registration with HubBroker

- The sender registers as a Peppol participant through HubBroker
- Receives their Peppol ID configuration
- HubBroker registers the sender in the Peppol SMP (Service Metadata Publisher) directory



Invoice Creation 2.

- Sender creates invoice in their ERP/accounting system
- Invoice is converted to Peppol BIS Billing 3.0 format (UBL or CII XML standard)
- For German requirements, XRechnung format (CII-based) is commonly used

Transmission via HubBroker

- Sender submits the e-invoice to HubBroker (via API, file upload, or system integration)
- HubBroker validates the invoice format and content
- HubBroker looks up the receiver's access point in the Peppol SML/SMP directory
- HubBroker sends the invoice through the Peppol network to the receiver's access point

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Inbound E-Invoicing Process (Receiving)

1. Registration with HubBroker

- The receiver registers their Peppol ID with HubBroker
- HubBroker publishes the receiver's endpoint information in the Peppol SMP directory
- This makes the receiver discoverable to all Peppol senders

2. Invoice Reception

- When a sender transmits an invoice to the receiver's Peppol ID, the sender's access point queries the Peppol directory
- The directory returns HubBroker's endpoint information
- The invoice is routed through the Peppol network to HubBroker

3. Processing via HubBroker

- HubBroker receives and validates the incoming e-invoice
- HubBroker can transform the invoice format if needed (e.g., from XML to the receiver's preferred format)
- HubBroker notifies the receiver of the new invoice



4. Delivery to Receiver

- Invoice is delivered to the receiver through their preferred method:
- Direct integration with ERP/accounting system (API)
- Web portal access through HubBroker's platform
- Email notification with download link
- File transfer (SFTP, AS2, etc.)

German-Specific Requirements

For domestic German e-invoicing via Peppol, ensure:

- XRechnung standard: XRechnung is the German e-invoice standard based on EN 16931 (European standard)
- **Leitweg-ID**: For public sector invoicing, the Leitweg-ID routing identifier is mandatory
- **VAT requirements**: Invoices must include German VAT information (USt-IdNr.) correctly formatted
- **ZUGFeRD** compatibility: HubBroker can handle ZUGFeRD hybrid format (PDF/A with embedded XML)
- Language: Invoice content typically in German for domestic transactions
- Legal compliance: Adherence to German invoicing regulations (§ 14 UStG -Umsatzsteuergesetz)
- Archiving requirements: GoBD (Grundsätze zur ordnungsmäßigen Führung und Aufbewahrung von Büchern) compliance for digital record-keeping

German E-Invoicing Reform (Mandatory B2B E-Invoicing)

Germany is implementing mandatory B2B e-invoicing as part of the Wachstumschancengesetz (Growth Opportunities Act):

Implementation Timeline

- January 1, 2025: All businesses must be able to receive e-invoices (B2B domestic transactions)
- **January 1, 2027**: Businesses with annual turnover > €800,000 must send e-invoices
- January 1, 2028: All businesses must send e-invoices for B2B domestic transactions

Key Requirements

- Structured formats: Only structured e-invoice formats compliant with EN 16931 are accepted (XRechnung, Peppol BIS, ZUGFeRD 2.x)
- No PDF invoices: Simple PDF invoices will no longer be compliant for B2B transactions
- **Recipient consent**: Initially, alternative formats may be used with explicit recipient consent
- **Domestic scope:** Mandate applies to domestic B2B transactions within Germany







Benefits of Using HubBroker as Service Provider

- Single connection: Connect once to reach all Peppol participants globally
- Format handling: HubBroker manages format conversions between XRechnung, ZUGFeRD, Peppol BIS, and other formats

Implementation Steps

- Choose your Peppol ID (VAT-based, GLN, or Leitweg-ID for public sector)
- Sign agreement with HubBroker as your Peppol access point provider
- Configure integration between your systems and HubBroker
- Select format preferences (XRechnung, ZUGFeRD, or Peppol BIS)
- Test transactions in HubBroker's test environment
- Go live and start exchanging e-invoices domestically and internationally

German E-Invoicing Landscape

Germany has a rapidly evolving e-invoicing ecosystem with:

- Public sector mandate: XRechnung mandatory for federal government since November 2020
- **B2B mandate**: Phased mandatory e-invoicing for all B2B transactions starting 2025
- **XRechnung standard**: Official German e-invoice format based on CII (Cross Industry Invoice)
- **ZUGFeRD**: Popular hybrid format combining PDF with embedded XML data
- **Federal structure**: Different federal states (Bundesländer) may have specific requirements
- Peppol adoption: Growing recognition of Peppol as compliant infrastructure
- **EU alignment**: Full compliance with European e-invoicing directive EN 16931

Public Sector (B2G) Specific Requirements

For invoicing German public entities:

- **XRechnung mandatory**: All public sector invoices must use XRechnung format
- **Leitweg-ID required**: Unique routing identifier for each public entity







- **OZG-RE portals:** Various federal and state portals for e-invoice submission
- HubBroker routing: HubBroker can route invoices to appropriate public sector endpoints
- **Threshold**: E-invoicing mandatory for contracts above €1,000 (federal level)

Format Overview

XRechnung

- Official German standard: Based on EN 16931
- Syntax: UN/CEFACT CII XML
- **Scope**: Mandatory for public sector, accepted in B2B

ZUGFeRD

- Hybrid format: PDF/A with embedded XML invoice data
- **User-friendly**: Human-readable PDF with machine-readable data
- Versions: ZUGFeRD 2.x is compliant with EN 16931
- Popular in B2B: Widely adopted in German private sector

Peppol BIS Billing 3.0

- International standard: UBL-based format
- **Interoperability**: Enables cross-border e-invoicing
- EN 16931 compliant: Meets German and European requirements

Preparing for the German Mandate

To prepare for mandatory B2B e-invoicing:

- Immediate action (2025): Ensure ability to receive e-invoices
- **System readiness**: Upgrade ERP/accounting systems to handle structured e-invoices
- Format decision: Choose between XRechnung, ZUGFeRD, or Peppol BIS (or support multiple)
- **HubBroker integration**: Connect to HubBroker for comprehensive e-invoice capabilities
- **Staff training:** Prepare teams for the transition away from PDF invoices
- **Process updates:** Adapt workflows for fully digital invoice processing
- **Timeline planning:** Plan implementation based on your turnover threshold

Cross-Border Considerations

- Peppol advantage: Seamlessly handle both domestic German and international e-invoices
- Format flexibility: HubBroker converts between German formats (XRechnung/ZUGFeRD) and international standards
- **Single integration**: One connection serves both German mandate and international trading partners
