

Ask and answer questions about what a speaker says in order to gather additional information or clarify something that is not understood.

Ask and Answer Activity

1. Have one student describe how to be safe when sledding (or biking, running, etc.). Have other students ask questions about how to be safe when doing these activities.
2. Have one student describe how to take care of a pet (dog, fish, rabbit, etc.). Have other students ask questions to find out more about how to take care of a pet, and to learn about the differences in taking care of different pets.
3. Have one student describe how to make something out of snow. Have other students ask questions to find out more about how to make something out of snow. Have students discuss whether they could use sand or mud to make the same thing they could make with snow.
4. Have one student describe how they solved a problem. Have other students ask questions to find out more about how to solve a problem. Students could also discuss solutions to a problem they currently have in the classroom, school, or community.
5. Have one student describe how they could make the classroom a happier place. Have other students ask questions to build on the ideas from the student. Students could also discuss how to make school or community a happier place.
6. Have one student describe something they learned from another person. Have other students ask questions to build on the ideas from the student, like how long did it take to learn and if they had to practice.
