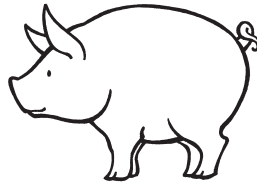

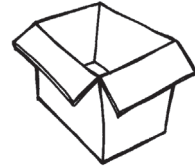

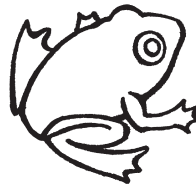

Special names for something or someone are called proper nouns. Proper nouns begin with a capital letter.

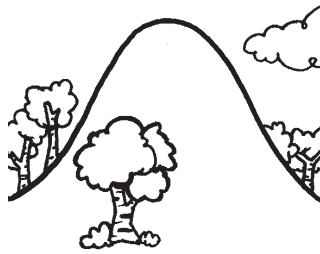
