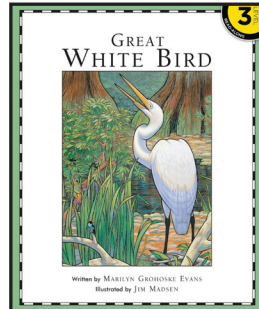

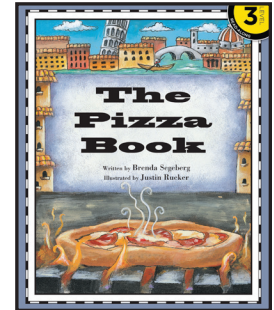
## Great White Bird

Read the book *Great White Bird* with your students. Lead students in a discussion where they identify the main purpose of the text, including what the author wants to answer, explain, or describe.



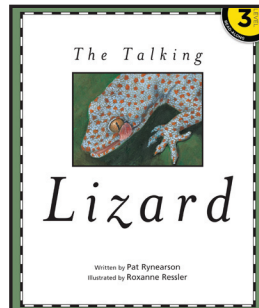
## The Pizza Book

Read *The Pizza Book* with your students. Lead students in a discussion where they identify the main purpose of the text, including what the author wants to answer, explain, or describe.



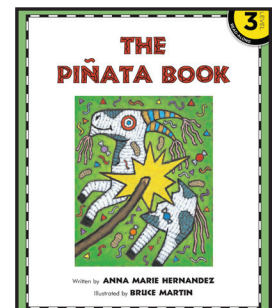
## The Talking Lizard

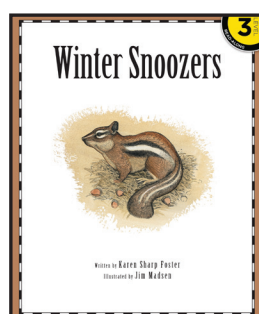
## The Piñata Book

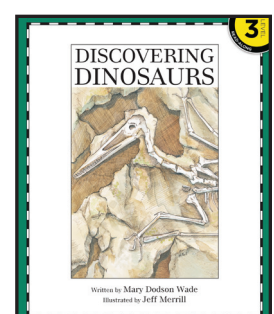
## Winter Snoozers

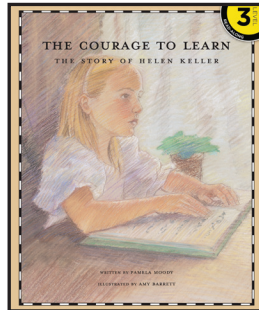

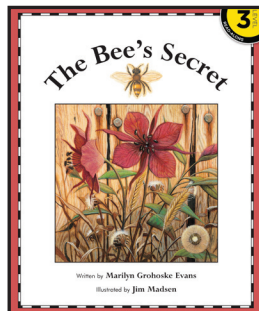
