

Recognize and read appropriate irregularly spelled words.

Lesson 1: /ɪ/

Word Pattern

Patterns -ild and -ind

Introduce the word patterns to your students by explaining that they will review the sound /ɪ/ in words like *child* and *blind*. Have them help you list other words that use the same word patterns. The following pattern words are found in *Louis Braille*.

blind, find, kind, child

Spelling

Use the pattern words, power words, and dictation sentence in your spelling activities.

SPELLING WORD LIST

Pattern: *child blind find*

Power: *two because*

The child had two books for the blind.

Lesson 2: /ō/

Word Pattern

Patterns -oll, -old, and -ost

Introduce the word patterns to your students by explaining that they will review the sound /ō/ in words like *roll*, *cold*, and *post*. Have them help you list other words that use the same word patterns. The following pattern words are found in *Trolls' Visit*.

*rolling, troll, trolls
cold, hold, old, told
host, posts*

Spelling

Use the pattern words, power words, and dictation sentence in your spelling activities.

SPELLING WORD LIST

Pattern: *roll cold post*

Power: *where your*

Where do you go in the cold?

Lesson 3: /f/

Word Pattern

Letter teams *ph* and *gh*

Introduce the word patterns to your students by explaining that these letter teams make the sound /f/ in words like *photo* and *laugh*. Then have them help you list other words that use the same word patterns. The following pattern words are found in *Photos for Phil*.

alphabet, dolphin, elephant, elephants, gopher, Phil, Phil's, phone, photo, photos, photograph, photographs, Ralph, Ralph's, cough, laugh, laughing

Spelling

Use the pattern words, power words, and dictation sentence in your spelling activities.

SPELLING WORD LIST

Pattern: *phone photo laugh*
Power: *baby over*

The photo of the baby made me laugh.

Lesson 4: Irregular Plurals

Word Pattern

Explain to your students that they will review plurals and learn about irregular plurals like *teeth* or *sheep*. Have them help you list other irregular plurals. The following pattern words are found in *Moose Are Not Meese*.

child, children *foot, feet*
goose, geese *mouse, mice*
deer, fish, moose, sheep

Spelling

Use the power word, irregular plurals, and dictation sentence in your spelling activities.

SPELLING WORD LIST

Irregular Plurals: *tooth teeth foot*
feet
Power: *words*

She lost one tooth, then two teeth.
