Bethel Elementary serves K-5 "rural and diverse" students in the Cabarrus County school district. Ms. Palomba, a spirited first year teacher, led her 4th grade team's Mangahigh implementation to supplement other digital programs currently in use.

Student engagement is key to successful classroom management and it can be a challenge for new teachers using technology in the workshop model. Her skills grew through the implementation as she learned to use Mangahigh's features to focus students' attention on assignments.

Ms. Palomba's 4th graders enthusiastically played Mangahigh challenges in their daily center rotations for independent practice during math workshop. The challenges kept her students engaged while she worked with small groups of students to address specific needs. 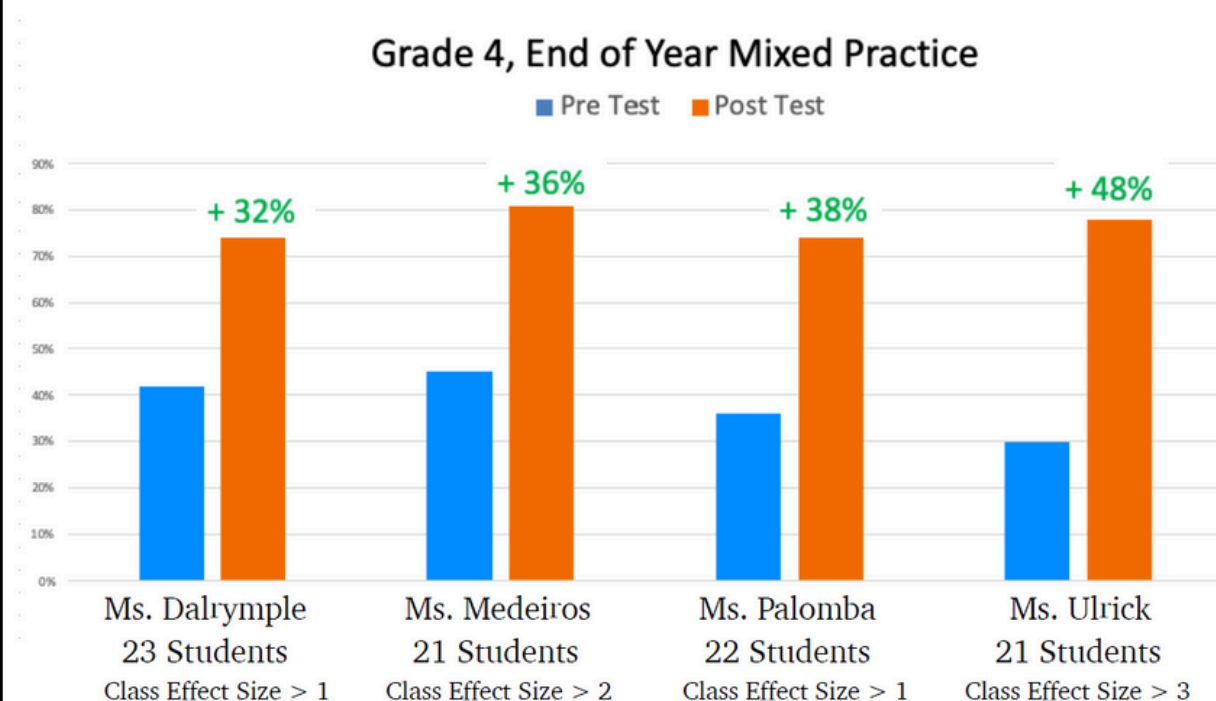
